- Location
- Exit A66 at Long Newton
 - Travel through Long Newton (for approx 1km)
 - Turn right down Long Newton Lane
 - Car Park is approx. 3km on left @ TS16 0QQ, NZ395154
- Terrain:
- This is a new forest park that has been planted for around thirteen years. It has an extensive path network and discrete plantations of varying aged trees. There is a significant stream that crosses the centre of the area east to west that can be difficult to cross because of the steep banks; there are good bridges to the east and west ends.
- Some forest blocks in the South have been brashed.
- The map was last updated in May 2018.
- Courses: 60/45 Minute Odds and Evens Score
- Map: 1:10,000 scale. Maps will be printed on waterproof paper.
- Punching system: EMIT touch free. Emitags are available for loan at registration. Lost Emitags charged at £50
