Travel Directions: Signed off the A326 at Dibden Purlieu at GR SU 410059; travel 400m SW down B3054 and turn right towards the Dibden Inclosure car park at GR SU 405057; nearest postcode SO45 4PR. Do not park in that car park, but follow orienteering signs to event park.

Terrain: Mixture of forest plantation with a good path network and open moor with scattered trees and the odd bog, plus a few contours.

Map: A4 size; scale 1:10000; partial updates in Nov 2018: map on waterproof paper; control descriptions on map and loose control description available.

Dress: Full leg and arm cover mandatory; that means no shorts or vests.
