Travel Directions: Map: Sheet 186, Signed of the Thursley Road at Grid SU895403 south of the double bends. Not at the DZ Huts. Nearest post code GU8 6QL

Terrain: Featuring some rarely used parts of Hankley. Mainly fast runnable forest, with some heathland on the longest courses. Enlarged map scale due to the high density of features in some areas

Mapping: Fully remapped in 2017 to ISOM 2017 by RLM Maps. Scale 7,500 overprinted on A4 waterproof proof paper. Control descriptions on map and loose at registration. Minor updates by the planner for this event.
