Travel Directions: Bordon Heath Military Training Area is just to the East of Bordon. Parking is at Grid SU783361 off the Oakhanger Road nearest Post Code GU35 9HJ. Signed off the new Bordon By Pass (A325) Louiburg Ave/Oakhanger Rd traffic lights at Grid SU788362

Terrain: Mixed woodland with intricate track systems and sandy open areas
Warning note: The Slab is a military training area – do not touch any suspicious objects of any kind.

Mapping: Scale 1:7,5,000, A5 size, printed on waterproof paper.
Map updated 2018 with minor updates for this event.

Score: 26 controls Suitable for all
All course distances and climb are subject to final controlling.
