Travel: Coatham Woods is located South of the A66 (heading towards Middlesbrough). Take the A67

off the A66 and head for Urlay Nook. Turn left onto Long Newton Lane and Coatham Woods

car park will be on your right. Nearest Postcode TS16 0QQ

Terrain: The area has forest blocks with extensive tracks throughout and a steep banked stream

running the width of the map. This should only be crossed at the footbridges. This location has

had plenty of rain recently and the ground is very muddy throughout so good footwear is

essential.

Mapping: 1:10,000 A4 Pre-marked on waterproof paper. Loose descriptions will be available in the start

lanes. Map updated in Nov 19.

All runners must download - even if they don't finish the course!

Orienteering is an adventure sport and in the Army is classed as individual military training. Competitors are responsible for their own personal safety and for assessing their own abilities to complete the course.
