Date: Wednesday 4 August 2021

Location: QECP, OS Landranger Map 186, SU719181. Signed off A3 south of Petersfield. What3words is *wishes.snowmen.agreed*. Once through the electronic parking barriers drive to the top of the main hill for car parking, which means drive past the Centre building and stay on the main road as it winds up to the very top of the hill.

Terrain: The map is heavily wooded with very deep valleys and high spurs to the north, the southern area is less steep but has some felled areas which are marked on the map, water features minimal at this time of the year. The courses all start at the top of the hill to minimise the climb. Dogs are permitted out on the courses.

Registration : Pre entry at www.racesignup.co.uk. EMIT Touch-free system being used.

Cost: Military: £4.00 plus £1.50 for EMIT if required.
Civilian: £7.50 plus £1.50 for EMIT if required.

Map: Map partly updated 2021. 1:10,000. Contour Interval 5mtrs. Courses overprinted on waterproof paper.

Facilities: Toilets in car park area and in the main park centre, there is also a café kiosk at the top by the toilets, as well as main café and shop in the main park centre.

Parking QECP now has an automatic barrier entry system. A special daily rate is being negotiated and will be confirmed later.

ORIENTEERING IN THE ARMY IS CLASSED AS MILITARY TRAINING BUT MTBO IS NOT.

For civilians participating in Army orienteering, Public Liability Insurance is provided by Towergate; individuals are advised to have their own private accident insurance. This event is conducted iaw British Orienteering Rules 2018 (v3.7). Orienteering in the Army is classed as individual military training, but MTBO is not. This event is on Forestry Commission land, so dogs are allowed.
