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- OCAD interface, map symbols and drawing tools.
- Drawing scales, their selection and why.
- Create base maps using the "New Map Wizard".
- Obtain terrain information (LIDAR) from the Environment Agency & use the "DEM Import Wizard" to turn it into contours and other useful layers.
- Use geo-referenced Google Earth Images as background maps.
- Fitting "older" OCAD maps to the new base map and when to use this and update it or just as a background to draw over.
- Colours, their hierarchy and relationship to symbols.
- OCAD Sketch App and how it works.
- Using the Sketch App to simplify your survey.
- Bringing the Sketch App survey data back into your map.
- Map drawing essentials using a simple map:
- o Drawing line features.
- o Drawing point features.
- o Following curves/symbols.
- o Adding points to line features.
- o Cutting holes in areas.
- o Cutting areas into separate parts.
- Practice the drawing techniques using the survey data.
- Map layouts, the essentials and the optional.

- Map reference numbering and authorities.
- Drawing the key.
- Finishing map and printing.
- Creating custom symbols.
